- Requirements:** Pullman High School senior student who will graduate this academic year.
- Award Criteria:** The successful applicant must be:
1. A senior student at Pullman High School interested in a career in teaching or special education. If a current PHS Senior does not apply, a former PHS graduate currently studying for a career in teaching or special education can be considered.
 2. Someone who has served as a volunteer in the community.
 3. Minimum 3.0 PHS cumulative grade point average
- Amount of Scholarship:** **\$4000**— This scholarship is to be used for tuition, housing or fees at a 4-year college or university. The scholarship will be paid to and disbursed through your student account at the institution of choice for use during the 2025-2026 academic year.
- Application Process:** Applicants must submit:
1. application form (found on the back of this sheet)
 2. two letters of reference: at least one from a teacher, coach, or counselor. (The other letter can be from a member of the community not related to the student who knows the applicant well.)
- APPLICATION DEADLINE:** **April 18th, 2025.** Turn in your hardcopy application with any required materials at the PHS Counseling Center. Incomplete applications or applications received after the deadline will NOT be considered.

Review of applicants is done by the PEF Scholarship Committee. The Scholarship will be presented at the annual PHS Awards Night to culminate the year. The PULLMAN EDUCATION FOUNDATION reserves the right to alter, amend, withdraw or terminate this scholarship offer at any time and reserves the right not to award this scholarship, all within the sole discretion of the PULLMAN EDUCATION FOUNDATION.
